## APPLICATION OF DEBEVOISE & PLIMPTON LLP FOR ORDER (I) ALLOWING AND APPROVING INTERIM COMPENSATION AND EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE PERIOD FROM APRIL 1, 2003 – DECEMBER 9, 2003; (II) ALLOWING AND APPROVING FINAL COMPENSATION AND EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE PERIOD FROM FEBRUARY 12, 2002 – DECEMBER 9, 2003; AND (III) AUTHORIZING THE DEBTORS TO PAY OUTSTANDING FEES AND EXPENSES

Debevoise & Plimpton LLP ("Debevoise") hereby makes its application (the

"Application") to this Court, as special counsel for Global Crossing Ltd. ("Global Crossing" or

the "Company") and certain of its affiliates, as debtors and debtors-in-possession (collectively,

"the Debtors"), (i) allowing and approving interim compensation for professional services

rendered and reimbursement of expenses incurred from April 1, 2003 through December 9, 2003

(the "Covered Period"); (ii) allowing and approving final compensation for professional services

rendered and reimbursement of expenses incurred from February 12, 2002 through December 9,

2003 (the "Retention Period") and (iii) to the extent not already paid, authorizing the Debtors to

pay outstanding fees and expenses, all as further described herein. Debevoise respectfully represents in support hereof as follows:

1. This Application is made pursuant to Sections 330 and 331 of Title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code") and Rule 2016 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure (the "Bankruptcy Rules"). Debevoise seeks an Order (i) granting interim allowance and approval of compensation for professional services rendered during the Covered Period in the amount of \$6,741,972.30, as well as reimbursement of expenses incurred during the Covered Period in the amount of \$455,121.62, for a total of \$7,197,093.92; (ii) granting final allowance and approval of compensation for professional services rendered during the Retention Period in the amount of \$26,486,208.53, as well as reimbursement of expenses incurred during the Retention Period in the amount of \$2,021,873.57, for a total of \$28,508,082.10; and (iii) directing the Debtors to pay to Debevoise all fees and expenses not heretofore paid during the Retention Period, including, but not limited to, \$2,301,581.00 due and owing for services rendered and expenses incurred during the Covered Period, as well as any other amounts previously held back pursuant to this Court's Order Pursuant to Sections 105(a) and 331 of the Bankruptcy Code Establishing Procedures for Interim Monthly Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses of Professionals, dated January 28, 2002 (as amended, modified or supplemented from time to time, the "Fee Procedures Order"), all as more fully set forth below. Any objection will be heard at the hearing for this Application, in accordance with the Fee Procedures Order.

2. Attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u> is a billing summary showing, for the Covered Period, the total hours billed to each project category, the composite hourly billing rate for the project category, and, for each professional or paraprofessional charging time to the project

category, his or her name, hourly rate and hours billed. Debevoise seeks allowance of payment for a total of 13,299 hours expended, including 11,652.3 hours of attorneys' time and 1,646.7 hours of paraprofessionals' time.<sup>1</sup> Attached hereto as <u>Exhibit B</u> is a breakdown of charges and expenses incurred during the Covered Period.<sup>2</sup>

#### **Background**

#### A. Generally

3. On January 28, 2002, April 24, 2002, August 4, 2002 and August 30, 2002, the

Debtors commenced these cases under Chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code. The Debtors continue to manage their businesses and properties as debtors-in-possession pursuant to Sections 1107(a) and 1108 of the Bankruptcy Code. No trustee or examiner has been appointed herein.

Reimbursement of some of the charges and disbursements incurred during the Covered Period but not included in <u>Exhibit B</u> might be sought in the future because bills for such charges and disbursements were not received, or Debevoise was otherwise unable to process such charges and disbursements through its internal accounting system, in time for inclusion in this Application.

4. This Court has jurisdiction over these cases and this Motion pursuant to 28 U.S.C.
§§ 157 and 1334(b). Venue is proper in this District pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1408 and 1409(a) and Bankruptcy Rule 5005(a)(1).

5. No prior request has been made to this Court or any other court for the relief sought herein.

6. The Debtors' Chapter 11 cases have been consolidated for procedural purposes only and are being jointly administered pursuant to an Order of this Court.

#### B. Retention of Debevoise and Case Status

7. The Debtors and/or certain of their current and former directors and officers (the "Directors and Officers") are currently defendants in more than 80 class action lawsuits and other cases alleging violations of securities laws, the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), and other laws. They also are or have been the subjects of Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") and United States Department of Justice ("DOJ") investigations relating to the Debtors' accounting practices. In addition, the United States Department of Labor ("DOL") is investigating related issues. In early February 2002, the Debtors selected Debevoise as special counsel for the securities, ERISA and other cases, the regulatory and government investigations, and other issues as they arose.

8. By Order dated March 25, 2002 (the "Retention Order"), a copy of which is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit C</u>, this Court authorized the Debtors to retain Debevoise as counsel pursuant to Sections 327(e) and 328(a) of the Bankruptcy Code, effective as of February 12, 2002.

9. On December 26, 2002, this Court confirmed the Debtors' Joint Plan of Reorganization (the "Plan"). The Plan became effective on December 9, 2003 (the "Effective Date").

#### C. Previous Compensation of Debevoise.

10. Under the Fee Procedures Order, each professional must file, in addition to monthly fee statements (each a "Fee Statement"), an application for interim or final Court approval and allowance of compensation and reimbursement of expenses pursuant to Section 331 of the Bankruptcy Code approximately every 150 days. Pursuant to the Fee Procedures Order, Debevoise submitted the following fee statements for the period February 12, 2002 through April 30, 2002 (the "First Fee Period"):

- (a) On April 19, 2002, Debevoise submitted its first monthly fee statement in the amount of \$4,950,985.09, consisting of fees of \$4,730,276.30 and expenses of \$220,708.79 incurred from the Retention Date through March 31, 2002.
- (b) On May 20, 2002, Debevoise submitted its second monthly fee statement in the amount of \$1,778,418.60, consisting of fees of \$1,551,369.90 and expenses of \$227,048.70 incurred from April 1, 2002 through April 30, 2002.

11. Pursuant to the Fee Procedures Order, on June 28, 2002, Debevoise filed with this Court its interim fee application for the First Fee Period (the "First Interim Application"), seeking allowance of \$6,031,646.20 in interim compensation for professional services rendered and \$420,790.66 in expense reimbursement.<sup>3</sup> In response to a request by the Office of the United States Trustee (the "U.S. Trustee"), Debevoise agreed to bill all non-working travel time at 50% of its regular rates, and thus agreed to reduce the fees in its First Interim Application by \$21,970.90. As a result, Debevoise sought \$6,009,675.30 in its First Interim Application. By Order of this Court, dated August 7, 2002 (the "First Fee Order"), Debevoise was awarded

interim fees in the amount of \$5,408,707.77 (representing 90% of its agreed compensation of \$6,009,675.30) and interim expenses in the amount of \$420,790.66, for a total amount of \$5,829,498.43. A copy of the First Fee Order is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit D</u>. Pursuant to the First Fee Order, the Court continued to hold back 10% of the fees sought by Debevoise in the First Interim Application.

12. Pursuant to the Fee Procedures Order, Debevoise submitted the following fee statements for the period May 1, 2002 through September 30, 2002 (the "Second Fee Period"):

- (a) On June 21, 2002, Debevoise submitted its third monthly fee statement in the amount of \$1,486,671.75, consisting of fees of \$1,354,483.80 and expenses of \$132,187.95 incurred from May 1, 2002 through May 31, 2002.
- (b) On July 19, 2002, Debevoise submitted its fourth monthly fee statement in the amount of \$1,588,255.37, consisting of fees of \$1,511,218.80 and expenses of \$77,036.57 incurred from June 1, 2002 through June 30, 2002.
- (c) On August 20, 2002, Debevoise submitted its fifth monthly fee statement in the amount of \$1,486,521.39, consisting of fees of \$1,366,024.85 and expenses of \$120,496.54 incurred from July 1, 2002 through July 31, 2002.
- (d) On September 20, 2002, Debevoise submitted its sixth monthly fee statement in the amount of \$750,064.06, consisting of fees of \$664,706.55 and expenses of \$85,357.51 incurred from August 1, 2002 through August 31, 2002.
- (e) On October 18, 2002, Debevoise submitted its seventh monthly fee statement in the amount of \$1,332,988.54, consisting of fees of \$1,223,973.20 and expenses of \$109,015.34 incurred from September 1, 2002 through September 30, 2002.

13. Pursuant to the Fee Procedures Order, on November 25, 2002, Debevoise filed its interim fee application for the Second Fee Period (the "Second Interim Application") with the Court, seeking allowance of \$6,117,145.00 in interim compensation for professional services rendered and \$521,938.31 in expense reimbursement. In response to a request by the committee appointed pursuant to the Fee Committee and Fee Procedures Protocol dated August 21, 2002 (the "Fee Committee"), Debevoise agreed to reduce its fees by \$7,656.00 and its expenses by \$33,504.00. By Order of this Court, dated June 4, 2003 (the "Second Interim Order"), Debevoise was awarded interim fees in the amount of \$4,887,591.20 (representing 80% of its agreed compensation of \$6,109,489.00) and interim expenses in the amount of \$488,434.31, for a total amount of \$5,376,025.51. A copy of the Second Interim Order is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit E</u>. Pursuant to the Second Fee Order and to the letter of the Fee Committee dated June 30, 2003, this Court continued to hold back (i) 20% of the fees sought by Debevoise in the Second Interim Application and (ii) 10% of the fees sought by Debevoise in the First Interim Application.

14. Pursuant to the Fee Procedures Order, Debevoise submitted the following fee statements for the period October 1, 2002 through March 31, 2003 (the "Third Fee Period"):

- (a) On November 20, 2002, Debevoise submitted its eighth monthly fee statement in the amount of \$1,338,955.84, consisting of fees of \$1,214,044.55 and expenses of \$124,911.29 incurred from October 1, 2002 through October 31, 2002.
- (b) On December 20, 2002, Debevoise submitted its ninth monthly fee statement in the amount of \$1,121,737.89, consisting of fees of \$994,733.22 and expenses of \$127,004.67 incurred from November 1, 2002 through November 30, 2002.

- (c) On January 21, 2003, Debevoise submitted its tenth monthly fee statement in the amount of \$1,175,166.66, consisting of fees of \$1,064,550.20 and expenses of \$110,616.46 incurred from December 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002.
- (d) On February 20, 2003, Debevoise submitted its eleventh monthly fee statement in the amount of \$1,599,259.34, consisting of fees of \$1,521,422.45 and expenses of \$77,836.89 incurred from January 1, 2003 through January 31, 2003.
- (e) On March 20, 2003, Debevoise submitted its twelfth monthly fee statement in the amount of \$1,744,605.73, consisting of fees of \$1,637,203.48 and expenses of \$107,402.25 incurred from February 1, 2003 through February 28, 2003.
- (f) On April 21, 2003, Debevoise submitted its thirteenth monthly fee statement in the amount of \$1,334,354.42, consisting of fees of \$1,193,853.05 and expenses of \$140,501.37 incurred from March 1, 2003 through March 31, 2003.

15. Pursuant to the Fee Procedures Order, on June 2, 2003, Debevoise filed its interim fee application for the Third Fee Period (the "Third Interim Application") with the Court, seeking allowance of \$7,625,071.93 in interim compensation for professional services rendered and \$657,526.98 in expense reimbursement.<sup>4</sup> By Order of this Court, dated December 16, 2003 (the "Third Fee Order"), Debevoise was awarded interim fees in the amount of \$6,100,057.54

(representing 80% of its agreed compensation of \$7,625,071.93) and interim expenses in the amount of \$657,526.98, for a total amount of \$6,757,584.52. A copy of the Third Fee Order is attached hereto as Exhibit F.

16. The Third Fee Order also authorized the Debtors to release all amounts previously held back upon reaching the Effective Date. On December 10, 2003, Debevoise received payment of all amounts held back pursuant to the First Fee Order, the Second Fee Order and the Third Fee Order. Debevoise has no outstanding fees or expenses from the First, Second or Third Fee Period.

17. Pursuant to the Fee Procedures Order, Debevoise submitted the following fee statements for the period April 1, 2003 through the Effective Date (the "Fourth Fee Period"):

(a) On May 20, 2003, Debevoise submitted its fourteenth monthly fee statement (the "Fourteenth Fee Statement") in the amount of \$1,318,786.14, consisting of fees of \$1,234,731.85 and expenses of \$150,189.09 (less a credit of \$66,134.80)<sup>5</sup> incurred from April 1, 2003 through April 30, 2003. On July 29, 2003, Debevoise received a payment of \$1,071,839.77, representing approximately 80% of the fees, or \$967,785.48, and 100% of the expenses requested in the Fourteenth Fee Statement.

(b) On June 20, 2003, Debevoise submitted its fifteenth monthly fee statement (the "Fifteenth Fee Statement") in the amount of \$1,082,705.68, consisting of fees of \$1,010,758.13 and expenses of \$71,947.55 incurred from May 1, 2003 through May 31, 2003. On September 3, 2003, Debevoise received a payment of

\$880,554.05, representing approximately 80% of the fees, or \$808,606.50, and 100% of the expenses requested in the Fifteenth Fee Statement.

- (c) On July 21, 2003, Debevoise submitted its sixteenth monthly fee statement (the "Sixteenth Fee Statement") in the amount of \$627,157.20, consisting of fees of \$622,750.15 and expenses of \$4,407.05 incurred from June 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003.
- (d) On August 20, 2003, Debevoise submitted its seventeenth monthly fee statement
  (the "Seventeenth Fee Statement") in the amount of \$655,696.96, consisting of
  fees of \$599,714.41 and expenses of \$55,982.55 incurred from July 1, 2003
  through July 31, 2003. On October 24, 2003, Debevoise received a payment of
  \$1,038,361.25, representing (i) approximately 80% of the fees, or \$498,200.12,
  and 100% of the expenses requested in the Sixteenth Fee Statement, and (ii)
  approximately 80% of the fees, or \$479,771.53, and 100% of the expenses
  requested in the Seventeenth Fee Statement.
- (e) On September 22, 2003, Debevoise submitted its eighteenth monthly fee statement (the "Eighteenth Fee Statement") in the amount of \$431,584.70, consisting of fees of \$386,916.60 and expenses of \$44,668.10 incurred from August 1, 2003 through August 31, 2003.
- (f) On October 20, 2003, Debevoise submitted its nineteenth monthly fee statement
  (the "Nineteenth Fee Statement") in the amount of \$762,964.82, consisting of fees
  of \$730,149.32 and expenses of \$32,815.50 incurred from September 1, 2003
  through September 30, 2003.

- (g) On November 20, 2003, Debevoise submitted its twentieth monthly fee statement
  (the "Twentieth Fee Statement") in the amount of \$1,073,550.80, consisting of
  fees of \$1,030,320.38 and expenses of \$43,230.42 incurred from October 1, 2003
  through October 31, 2003. On December 10, 2003, Debevoise received payment
  of \$1,838,623.07, representing (i) approximately 80% of the fees, or \$309,533.28,
  and 100% of the expenses requested in the Eighteenth Fee Statement; (ii)
  approximately 80% of the fees, or \$584,119.46, and 100% of the expenses
  requested in the Nineteenth Fee Statement; and (iii) approximately 80% of the
  fees, or \$824,256.31, and 100% of the expenses requested in the Twentieth Fee
  Statement.
- (h) On December 22, 2003, Debevoise submitted its twenty-first monthly fee statement (the "Twenty-First Fee Statement") in the amount of \$902,559.69, consisting of fees of \$873,655.97 and expenses of \$28,903.72 incurred from November 1, 2003 through November 30, 2003.
- (i) On January 20, 2004, Debevoise submitted its twenty-second monthly fee statement (the "Twenty-Second Fee Statement") in the amount of \$224,759.52, consisting of fees of \$252,975.50 (less a credit of \$51,193.62)<sup>6</sup> and expenses of \$22,977.64 incurred from December 1, 2003 through the Effective Date.

18. Debevoise has not yet received any payment in connection with its Twenty-First Fee Statement or its Twenty-Second Fee Statement. With respect to amounts sought during the Fourth Fee Period, the remainder of fees due and owing for services rendered during the period

April 1, 2003 through October 31, 2003, totaling \$1,123,068.16, have been held back pursuant to the Fee Procedures Order.

#### Summary of Legal Services Rendered During the Covered Period

19. During the Covered Period, Debevoise performed numerous professional services for the Debtors in connection with these Chapter 11 cases. Throughout the Covered Period, Debevoise has coordinated its work with that of the Company's bankruptcy counsel on a number of fronts, including managing certain litigation and advising in connection with SEC filings, monthly operating reports, and other disclosures. In view of the submission of Debevoise's complete daily time records, this Application only summarizes Debevoise's principal activities during the Covered Period segregated, to the extent practicable, by project categories as identified in Exhibit A.<sup>7</sup>

## A. <u>Shareholder Class Actions</u><sup>8</sup>

20. During the Covered Period, Debevoise devoted significant time and effort to responding to the numerous shareholder and investor actions, including:

- working on potential settlement and related insurance and other issues, including participation in mediation sessions with Magistrate Judge Dolinger, plaintiffs' counsel and co-counsel;
- reviewing recent filings and decisions; preparing various motions, responsive papers and correspondence, and researching related issues;

- communicating with co-counsel, counsel for co-defendants and clients about litigation status, case management and strategy; and
- communicating with plaintiffs' counsel about case-management and settlement issues.

Total Hours: 6,169.1

## B. **ERISA Actions**<sup>7</sup>

21. During the Covered Period, Debevoise spent considerable time and effort responding

to the numerous ERISA actions, including:

- working on potential settlement and related insurance and other issues, including participation in mediation sessions with Magistrate Judge Dolinger, plaintiffs' counsel and co-counsel;
- continued communication with the U.S. Department of Labor (the "DOL") and giving attention to certain DOL inquiries and related matters;
- reviewing recent filings and decisions; preparing various motions, responsive papers and correspondence, and researching related issues;
- giving advice on procedures for Gary Winnick's contribution toward 401(k) plan losses;
- communicating with co-counsel, counsel for co-defendants and clients about litigation status, case management and strategy; and
- communicating with plaintiffs' counsel about case-management and settlement issues.

Total Hours: 1,711.8

#### C. <u>Government Investigations</u>

22. During the Covered Period, Debevoise provided a vast array of services with regard

to the various investigations being conducted against the Debtors, including:

• Continuing discussions with the SEC, clients, counsel for co-defendants and co-counsel pertaining to the resolution of the SEC's pending investigation, and researching related issues.

Total Hours: 1,439.2

## D. <u>Pender Litigation</u>

23. During the Covered Period, Debevoise devoted time to matters relating to the

ongoing dispute over the scope of an insurance policy issued by Pender Insurance Limited

("Pender"), including:

- researching pressing matters relating to insurance coverage, and drafting correspondence, memoranda and court filings regarding the same;
- attempting to arrange a procedure to resolve insurance coverage disputes; and
- communicating with Pender's counsel and with attorneys for the Shareholder Class Action and ERISA plaintiffs about coverage issues and possible resolutions.

Total Hours: 1,637.7

# E. <u>Employment Law Claims</u><sup>9</sup>

- preparing and filing motion and other papers and researching related issues, and discussing litigation status, case management and strategy;
- communicating with plaintiff's counsel regarding a potential settlement and other matters; and
- giving attention to certain insurance issues.

Total Hours: 784.8

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>9</sup> One of the cases (the *Olofson* case) currently proceeding against certain former Directors and Officers asserts tort claims arising from the alleged termination of Olofson's employment, as well as a defamation claim against one former Director. Those claims, including related fees and expenses, ultimately might be covered by an Employment Practices Liability insurance policy (the "EPL Policy"). To date, the Debtors have been submitting fee statements to the Debtors' directors and officers liability insurers because the fees and expenses so far are not being otherwise reimbursed under the EPL policy. Should the EPL Policy become an available resource, the Debtors and Debevoise will seek this Court's authorization, if necessary, to use that policy's proceeds to pay Debevoise's fees and expenses in connection with the *Olofson* case.

## F. Other Related Matters

24. During the Covered Period, Debevoise devoted time to matters relating to the maintenance of the bankruptcy proceedings and administration of the Debtors' day-to-day affairs, including:

- researching certain corporate governance, tax and auditing issues and assisting the Debtors with certain SEC reporting and compliance matters;
- coordinating with Debtors' counsel on various representation issues; and
- giving continued attention to matters relating to insurance coverage.

Total Hours: 1,415.1

## G. Fee Application

25. This category applies to time spent preparing Interim Fee Applications and preparing for and attending related hearings.

Total Hours: 61.8<sup>10</sup>

# H. Non-Working Travel Time

26. Debevoise has segregated all time spent traveling with respect to these matters, but not spent working on these matters. Fees associated with such travel time have been reduced by 50%. No fees have been billed to the Debtor for time spent traveling on these matters during which the timekeeper was working on matters for other clients.

Total Hours: 79.5

# Final Compensation Requested by Debevoise

27. By this Application, Debevoise also requests final allowance of \$28,508,082.10 for

the Complete Compensation Period, representing \$26,486,208.53 as compensation for

professional services rendered and \$2,021,873.57 as reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses Debevoise incurred. Attached as <u>Exhibit G</u> are billing summaries showing, for the Retention Period, the total hours billed to each project category, the aggregate fees and expenses billed to each project category, and, for each professional or paraprofessional charging time to Global Crossing matters, his or her name, hourly rate and hours billed to these matters during the Retention Period. Attached hereto as <u>Exhibit H</u> is a breakdown of charges and expenses incurred during the Retention Period.

28. As further set forth in the Summary preceding this Application, in accordance with Debevoise's prior fee applications in these Chapter 11 cases, which have been approved on an interim basis by this Court pursuant to the First Fee Order, the Second Fee Order and the Third Fee Order, respectively, Debevoise has received \$19,744,236.23 in fees and \$1,566,751.95 in actual and necessary disbursements, for a total of \$21,310,988.18. During the Fourth Fee Period, Debevoise has received \$4,492,272.66 for services rendered and \$403,240.26 for actual and necessary disbursements, for a total of \$4,492,272.66. Accordingly, \$2,301,581.00 remains due and owing by the Debtors to Debevoise, representing holdbacks on fees incurred from April 1, 2003 through October 1, 2003, plus fees and disbursements incurred but unpaid from November 1, 2003 through the Effective Date.

#### Value of Services

29. Debevoise is aware of the criteria in Section 330 of the Bankruptcy Code for determining the reasonableness of the compensation sought thereunder, including (i) the time spent on providing the services, (ii) the rates charged for such services, (iii) whether the services were necessary to the administration of the Chapter 11 cases and beneficial for the estates at the time that they were rendered, (iv) whether the services were performed within a reasonable amount of time commensurate with the complexity, importance and nature of each particular

problem, issue or task addressed, and (v) the customary compensation charged by comparably skilled practitioners in cases other than cases under the Bankruptcy Code. Debevoise respectfully submits that the compensation it is seeking for the services it rendered to the Debtors during the Covered Period is reasonable under the above criteria.

30. Debevoise's professional services required the expenditure of substantial time and effort by the firm's attorneys and paraprofessionals, often to the exclusion of services to other clients of the firm. During the Covered Period, Debevoise's attorneys and paraprofessionals spent approximately 11,652.3 hours and 1,646.7 hours, respectively, in rendering the necessary professional services for which compensation is sought.

31. During the Retention Period, Debevoise's attorneys and paraprofessionals spent approximately 47,469.6 hours and 16,487 hours, respectively, in rendering the necessary professional services for which compensation is sought.

32. Debevoise has endeavored to represent the Debtors in the most expeditious and economical manner possible. Tasks have been assigned to attorneys, legal assistants and other paraprofessionals at Debevoise so that work has been performed by those most familiar with the particular matter or task and, where attorney or paralegal involvement was required, by the lowest hourly-rate professional appropriate for a particular matter.

33. Accordingly, the reasonable value of the services rendered by Debevoise during the Covered Period is \$6,741,972.30.

34. The reasonable value of the services rendered by Debevoise during the Retention Period is \$26,486,208.53.

35. Debevoise submits that its services have conferred substantial benefit on the Debtors and their estates and have furthered the Debtors' ultimate goals in these Chapter 11

cases. Debevoise has expended extraordinary time and effort to oversee the sprawling shareholder and ERISA litigation and government investigations, and to attend to numerous intricate related matters as they arose. The time and effort required of Debevoise to administer these matters, as well as the variety and complexity of the legal issues that have arisen during the Covered Period, have been briefly summarized in this Application. Debevoise has been required to furnish extensive services that have often fully occupied the time of the attorneys involved to the exclusion of other firm matters. If this were not a case under the Bankruptcy Code, Debevoise would charge the Debtors and expect to receive on a current basis an amount at least equal to the amount requested herein for the professional services rendered.

#### **Reimbursement of Expenses**

36. Debevoise requests allowance and approval of reimbursement of actual, necessary expenses incurred in connection with the professional services rendered during the Covered Period in the amount of \$455,121.62.

37. Debevoise also requests final allowance and approval of reimbursement of actual, necessary expenses incurred in connection with the professional services rendered during the Retention Period of \$2,021,873.57.

38. Debevoise submits that the expenses it has incurred for attorney and paraprofessional overtime charges are reimbursable under the Administrative Orders, the U.S. Trustee Guidelines, and the recommendations of the Fee Committee. The time constraints frequently imposed by the circumstances of these cases have required Debevoise's attorneys and paraprofessionals to devote substantial amounts of time during the evenings and on weekends to the performance of necessary legal services for the Debtors. These extraordinary services were necessary to meet deadlines, satisfy the demands of the numerous government entities, and manage the shareholder and ERISA litigation. Consequently, Debevoise's personnel have been

required to incur overtime expenses in the discharge of certain of their professional responsibilities. Debevoise has made every effort to minimize these charges, and these charges were incurred only where, in the judgment of Debevoise's relevant professionals, they were necessary for the conduct of the case. The overtime charges reflected are for expenses actually paid and are billed at rates and in accordance with practices customarily employed by Debevoise and generally accepted by Debevoise's clients. Although Debevoise submits that overtime expenses incurred by secretarial personnel are reimbursable under the Administrative Orders and the U.S. Trustee Guidelines, Debevoise has not billed for secretarial overtime charges pursuant to an agreement between Debevoise and the Fee Committee.

39. Moreover, consistent with Debevoise's policy, attorneys and paraprofessionals who worked outside of normal business hours were reimbursed for their reasonable meal costs and their cost for transportation home. Debevoise's regular practice is not to include components for those charges in overhead when establishing billing rates and to charge its clients for these and other out-of-pocket disbursements incurred during the regular course of the rendition of services. All meal expenses included in this application satisfy the per-meal maximum charges and billing guidelines recommended by the Fee Committee.

40. Debevoise also submits that expenses incurred during ordinary business hours for library services and word processing are reimbursable under the Administrative Orders because such charges are not included in Debevoise's overhead for the purpose of setting its billing rates. Rather, Debevoise recognizes that different clients use such services in different amounts and bills each client accordingly. However, pursuant to an agreement between Debevoise and the Fee Committee, Debevoise has not billed for expenses pertaining to library services and word processing and document production.

41. Debevoise's charges for computer research, toll calls, postage, messenger services, overnight deliveries and car services are based on their actual cost to the firm.

42. Charges for courier, messenger services and car services have been minimized wherever possible. Such services were used only where less expensive means were impracticable.

43. For the purposes of this Fourth Interim Application, Debevoise has reduced its ordinary duplicating charges to \$1.10 per page and its outgoing telecopy charges to \$1.10 per page.

#### Rule 2016 Statements

44. Debevoise has received no payment for the services rendered in connection with these Chapter 11 cases, and has received no promise of payment for such services, other than in accordance with the Orders of this Court.

45. No previous allowance has been made to Debevoise for the services rendered and expenses incurred during the Covered Period, nor has Debevoise made any previous application for those services and expenses to this or any other Court, other than through the regular monthly Fee Statements filed pursuant to the Compensation Procedures Order.

46. By this Application, Debevoise seeks payment of compensation of any fees and expenses requested and not yet paid, less any applicable credits, as further described herein.

47. No agreement or understanding exists between Debevoise and any other person for the sharing of compensation received or to be received for services rendered in, or in connection with, these Chapter 11 cases.

48. Except as otherwise stated in the Retention Order, upon information and belief, the source of all compensation promised to be paid to Debevoise by the Debtors is revenues from the Debtors' business operations.

#### Waiver of Memorandum of Law

Debevoise submits that the relief sought herein does not raise any novel issues of law. Accordingly, Debevoise respectfully requests that the Court waive the requirement contained in Rule 9013-1(b) of the Local Bankruptcy Rules for the Southern District of New York that a separate memorandum of law be submitted.

#### <u>Notice</u>

In accordance with the Fee Procedures Order, notice of this Application has been provided to: (a) John B. Despins, Esq., Allan Brilliant, Esq.), (e) Brown Rudnick Berlack Israels LLP (attn: Edward S. Weisfelner, Esq., John P. Biedermann, Esq.); (f) KPMG (attn: Jane Moriarty, Philip Wallace, Malcolm Butterfield); (g) Shearman & Sterling (attn: James L. Garrity, Esq.); and (h) the members of the Fee Committee. The Debtors submit that no other or further notice need be provided. WHEREFORE, Debevoise respectfully requests that this Court enter an Order (i) granting interim allowance and approval of compensation for professional services rendered during the Covered Period in the amount of \$6,741,972.30, as well as reimbursement of expenses incurred during the Covered Period in the amount of \$455,121.62, for a total of \$7,197,093.92; (ii) granting final allowance and approval of compensation for professional services rendered during the Retention Period in the amount of \$26,486,208.53, as well as reimbursement of expenses incurred during the Retention Period in the amount of \$2,021,873.57, for a total of \$28,508,082.10; (iii) directing the Debtors to pay to Debevoise all fees and expenses not heretofore paid during the Retention Period, including, but not limited, to \$2,301,581.00 due and owing for services rendered and expenses incurred during the Covered Period, as well as any other amounts previously held back by this Court or pursuant to the Fee Procedures Order, all as further described herein; and (iv) granting such other and further relief as this Court may deem just and proper.

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upon all of the proceedings had before the Court and after due deliberation and sufficient cause appearing therefor, it is

ORDERED that the Applications set forth on Exhibit A annexed hereto are hereby approved; and it is further

ORDERED that compensation to the Professionals for professional services rendered during the time periods set forth on Exhibit A are hereby allowed in the amounts set forth on Exhibit A in the column entitled "Compensation Less 10% Holdback;" and it is further

ORDERED that the compensation paid to the Professionals in accordance with the preceding decretal paragraph shall be subject to subsequent order of this Court with respect to the allowance of the ten (10) percent holdback of the "Compensation Requested," as set forth on Exhibit A; and it is further

ORDERED that reimbursement to Professionals for expenses incurred during the time periods set forth on Exhibit A are hereby allowed in the amounts set forth on Exhibit A in the column entitled "Expenses;" and it is further
