EIGHTH AND FINAL APPLICATION OF RICHARDS, LAYTON & FINGER, P.A. FOR COMPENSATION AND FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES

Pursuant to sections 330 and 331 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code"), Rule 2016 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure (the "Bankruptcy Rules"), and the Court's Administrative Order Pursuant to Sections 105(a) and 331 of the Bankruptcy Code Establishing Procedures for Interim Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses of Professionals, dated October 29, 1999 (the "Administrative Order"), Richards, Layton & Finger, P.A. ("RL&F") hereby files this Eighth and Final Application for Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses (the "Final Application"). By this Final Application, RL&F seeks allowance of: (i) \$12,483.00 as compensation and \$8,530.00 for reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses for a total of \$21,013.00 for the eighth interim period June 1, 2000 through June 29, 2000 (the "Eighth Interim Period"); and (ii) final allowance of compensation of \$120,426.40 and reimbursement of related expenses of 136,625.85 for the period from October 28, 1999 through June

29, 2000 (the "Combined Compensation Period).\(^{1}\) In support of this Final Application, RL&F respectfully represents as follows:

Background

- 1. On October 29, 1999 (the "Petition Date"), Purina Mills, Inc. ("Purina") and certain of its direct and indirect subsidiaries, as debtors and debtors in possession (collectively the "Debtors") filed their voluntary petitions for relief under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code.
- 2. The Debtors' retention of RL&F was approved effective as of the Petition Date by this Court's Order dated October 29, 1999 ("Retention Order"). The Retention Order authorized RL&F to be compensated on an hourly basis and to be reimbursed for actual and necessary out-of-pocket expenses.
- 3. On April 5, 2000, the Court entered an order (the "Confirmation Order") confirming the Plan. Upon the completion of the various transactions contemplated by the Plan, the Plan became effective in accordance with its terms and the Debtors emerged from chapter 11 on June 29, 2000 (the "Effective Date").

Compensation Paid and Its Source

- 4. All services for which compensation is requested by RL&F were performed for or on behalf of the Debtors.
- 5. Except to the extent of the retainer paid to RL&F as described in the application seeking approval of RL&F's employment by the Debtors during the period covered by

this Application, RL&F has received no payment and no promises for payment from any source for services rendered or to be rendered in any capacity whatsoever in connection with the matters covered by this Application. There is no agreement or understanding between RL&F and any other person other than the directors of RL&F for the sharing of compensation to be received for services rendered in these cases.

Fee Statements

6. The fee statement for the Final Period of June 1, 2000 through and including June 29, 2000 is attached hereto as Exhibit A. This statement contains daily time logs describing the time spent by each attorney and paraprofessional for this period. To the best of RL&F's knowledge, this Application complies with sections 330 and 331 of the Bankruptcy Code, the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure, the Guidelines adopted by the Office of the United States Trustee, this Court's Order No. 32 and the Administrative Order.

Actual and Necessary Expenses

- 7. A summary of actual and necessary expenses and daily logs of expenses incurred by RL&F for the Final Period of June 1, 2000 through June 29, 2000 is attached hereto as Exhibit B. RL&F charges its bankruptcy clients \$.15 per page for photocopying expenses. RL&F also charges all of its clients \$1.00 per page for out-going facsimile transmissions. Actual long-distance carrier charges for outgoing facsimile transmissions are reflected in the long-distance telephone charges.
- 8. Regarding providers of on-line legal research (e.g., LEXIS and WESTLAW), RL&F charges all its clients the standard usage rates these providers charge, which, due to contractual flat fees, may not always equal RL&F's actual cost. RL&F is currently under contract to pay these providers a flat fee every month. For certain months the flat fee may be higher than

actual usage. For certain other months the flat fee may be lower than actual usage. Charging its clients the on-line providers' standard usage rates allows RL&F to cover adequately the monthly flat fees it must pay to these types of providers.

9. RL&F believes the foregoing rates are the market rates that the majority of law firms charge clients for such services. In addition, RL&F believes that such charges are in accordance with the American Bar Association's ("ABA") guidelines, as set forth in the ABA's Statement of Principles, dated January 12, 1995, regarding billing for disbursements and other charges.

In accordance with the factors enumerated in section 330 of the Bankruptcy Code, it is respectfully submitted that the amount requested by RL&F is fair and reasonable given (a) the complexity of these cases, (b) the time expended, (c) the nature and extent of the services rendered, (d) the value of such services, and (e) the costs of comparable services other than in a case under this title. Moreover, RL&F has reviewed the requirements of Order No. 32 and believes that this Application complies with that Order.

WHEREFORE, RL&F respectfully requests that the Court enter a final order, in the form attached hereto as Exhibit C, providing (i) that for the Eighth Interim Period of June 1, 2000 through June 29, 2000, an allowance be made to RL&F in the sum of \$12,483.00 as compensation

for necessary professional services rendered, and the sum of \$8,530,00 for reimbursement of actual and necessary costs and expenses, for a total of \$21,013.00, and (ii) that all compensation and expenses sought by RL&F for all interim periods, including the Eighth Interim Period, be approved in the amount of \$120,426.40 for necessary professional services rendered and \$136,625.85 for necessary costs and expenses, and for such other and further relief as this Court may deem just and proper.
